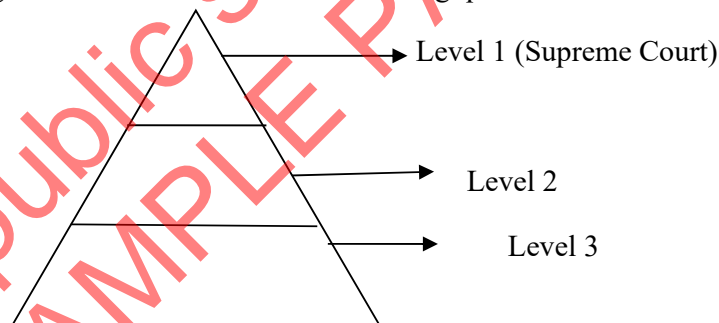

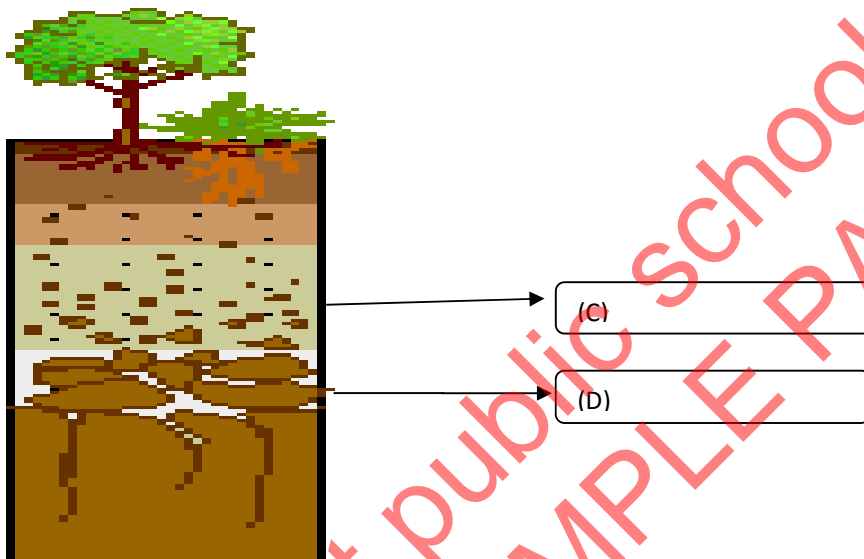
- What do you mean by public facilities? Give an example.
