Baba Amte, born in 1914, was a well-known Indian social worker and social activist. From early childhood, he was compassionate and sensitive. As a child, he often ate with the servants and played with poor children despite his parents' disapproval. He studied law and started practising as a lawyer. He participated in the Indian Freedom Struggle.

Baba Amte is best known for his work among lepers. The sight of leper in Warora was a turning point in his life. He dedicated all his life for the care of lepers and weaker sections of the society. In 1949 Baba Amte founded the famous Anandwan Ashram for the rehabilitation of lepers. Anandwan houses over 5000 people now.

He was awarded the Padma Shree and the Padma Vibhushan by the Government of India for his contributions in the field of social work. He was also awarded the prestigious Magsaysay Award, which is considered Asia's Nobel Prize. Apart from Anandwan and his work for the lepers, Amte devoted time to create awareness among people about the importance of the conservation of nature. He actively participated in the protest to save the Narmada River. What kept Amte's life distinct is that he never gave up in his fight for social justice.
